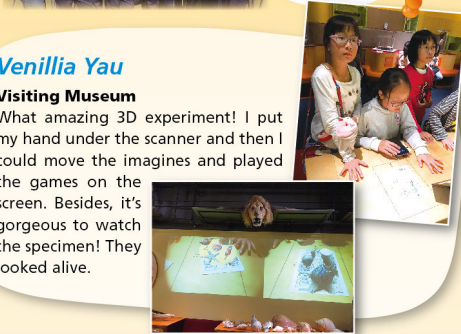
Clement Soong

We learned about "He Taonga Māori" (Māori Treasures) through stories relating to the past, present and future of the Maori culture in New Zealand.

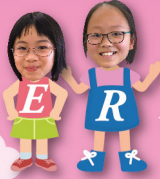


Origins tells the story of the geological origins - how New Zealand split from Gondwana - and the origins of the unique animal and plant life there.

We visited a lot of places where we enjoyed insights into how farmers in New Zealand farm their sheep and experienced the nature and met some of the friendly wildlife and farm animals.



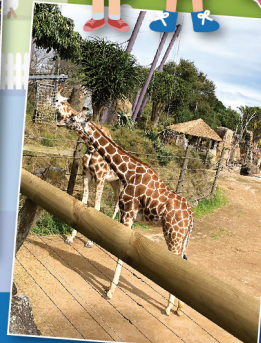
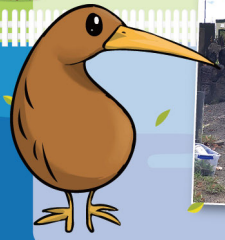
### Auckland Zoo
